

## **Energy and Water Nexus**

Presented by ASHRAE Dayton Panel Moderator: Evan Nutt, Trane

This presentation discusses the fundamentals of energy and water conservation in and around buildings, using case studies from around the world as examples. Different approaches to energy conservation are presented, ranging from architecturally integrated HVAC systems to innovative applications of packaged equipment. Water conservation strategies range from water conserving fixtures, to outdoor landscapes and through desalination of brackish groundwater.
